College Consortium for International Studies (CCIS)

The College of Staten Island (CSI) offers programs in conjunction with CCIS. Students at CCIS member institutions register their home institution, or at another CCIS member institution, and receive an accredited US transcript. Students pay program fees in US dollars and may use financial aid for the program abroad. Programs are reasonably priced and regularly evaluated to monitor the quality of the program and the satisfaction of the students.



Copenhagen Program

Copenhagen is a little bit off the beaten track, which is exactly why it is so interesting. A cosmopolitan capital and university center of 1.5 million people, Copenhagen is a safe and hospitable city that was founded in 1167 and now combines medieval charm with modern lifestyles and easy access to the rest of continental Europe. Most Danes speak English but students are encouraged to take Danish in order to enhance their understanding of Denmark.



University of Copenhagen

Academic Program: The DIS program is challenging but manageable. Courses are taught in English by Danish faculty, on a level comparable to selective home universities, at the **University of Copenhagen**. Semester and summer programs are offered in the following subjects: humanities, social sciences, international business, economics, architecture, design, biology, medical practice and policy, child development and diversity. No previous knowledge of Danish is required to participate in the program. A 3.0 GPA or better is required.

Housing & Meals: Living with a Danish family as a full family member, or with Danish students in a *kollegium* (residence hall), will immerse you in the Danish culture and give you an invaluable cross-cultural experience.

Extracurricular Activities: Experience Europe "from the inside" through the extended use of field studies in Copenhagen and through course-integrated study tours to other European countries. Some previous study tour destinations have included Amsterdam, Berlin, Brussels, Frankfurt, Gdynia, Helsinki, Luxembourg, Prague, Rotterdam, Russia, Stockholm, and Warsaw.
