MINOR CREDIT REQUIREMENTS

MINOR IN ART HISTORY

18 credits

The Minor in Art History is available to students pursuing any of the University's other bachelor degree programs.

At least six courses are required, including:

- ART 101 Art Antiquity **or**
- ART 102 Art Renaissance and Baroque **or**
- ART 103 Arts of Modernity
- Two lower-division Art History electives
- Junior seminar on methodologies
- Two upper-division Art History electives

MINOR IN CLASSICAL STUDIES AND CLASSICAL HERITAGE 18 credits

The Minor in Classical Studies and the Classical Heritage is available to students pursuing any of the University's other bachelor degree programs. There are three paths available:

- History
- Language (Latin)
- Literature

History Path

Students must take two of the following:

- HST 205 Survey of the History of Ancient Rome (Cross listed with CLS 205)
- HST 206 Survey of the History of Ancient Greece (Cross listed with CLS 206)
- HST 207 Life and Leisure in Ancient Rome (Cross listed with CLS 207)

Plus:

- HST 302 Caesar, Cicero and the Collapse of the Roman Republic (Cross listed with CLS 302)
- HST 310 Ancient Empires: Persia, Athens, Rome (Cross listed with CLS 310)

Plus two additional upper division Ancient History or Classical Studies courses.

Language (Latin) Path

Students must take:

LTN 101	Beginning Latin I
LTN 102	Beginning Latin II
LTN 201	Intermediate Latin
LTN 202	Readings in Latin Literature

Plus two additional upper division Latin language courses.

Literature Path

Students must take

CLS 201	Mythology
CLS 208	Roman Writings in Translation
CLS 304	Classical Greek and Roman Rhetoric
CLS 307	Epic and the Epic Tradition

Plus two additional upper division Classical Studies courses.

MINOR IN ARCHAEOLOGY

18 credits

The Minor in Archaeology is available to students pursuing any of the University's other bachelor degree programs. This minor focuses on the archaeology of the ancient classical world. It comprises a gateway course giving the historical background to the ancient classical world and then 9 credits in archaeology electives plus two art-related electives. It is strongly recommended that at least one credit is in Archaeology Practicum. In the event that the student has already studied the historical background to the ancient world the gateway requirement may be waved and all 12 credits earned in electives.
